HISTORY OF THE MEDICAL COLLEGE

Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Medical College, established in 2002 and Post Graduate courses started in the year 2012 attached to the century old Dr.Somervell Memorial Mission Hospital is situated in Kunnathukal village at Karakonam, Neyyattinkara in the southern border of the Trivandrum District of the State of Kerala. The Hospital, the Medical College and all other institutions attached to it are owned and managed by the South Kerala Diocese of the Church of South India (SIUC). This is the only Medical College for the CSI spread over the 5 Southern states of India and Srilanka. The South Kerala Medical Mission is a charitable society registered under the Travancore Cochin Literary, Scientific and Charitable Societies Registration Act XII of 1955. The office of the South Kerala Medical Mission is in the LMS Compound, Trivandrum 695 033, the Head Station of the CSI South Kerala Diocese which is one of the 24 Dioceses of Church of South India established in 1947 with Head Quarters at Chennai.

The Medical College is a self financing, minority institution, affiliated to the Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

Karakonam is 30 kilometers south (by Kanyakumari Road) from Trivandrum Central Railway Station, abutting the Vellarada Road from Trivandrum as well as Parassala. Dhanuvachapuram Railway station on the railway line between Trivandrum Central and Nagercoil is only 30 kms away from the college.

The healing Ministry of the church aims at producing highly competent medical graduates and postgraduates, possessing a high standard of professional skill. They should, in the days to come, be precious assets to our nation. We are committed to create in the campus the best possible atmosphere and infrastructure for quality medical education. Our aim is to strive at instilling our students with a spirit of sacrifice, compassion for the poor, love that nurture knows no limits, utmost humility in service and all Christian values needed for a meaningful and useful life of a doctor for which the founding fathers stood and sacrificed their lives to revive the closed and ailing missions hospitals of rural India, especially among the tribals and thus strengthen the Healing Ministry of the Church.

HISTORY OF THE MEDICAL COLLEGE HOSPITAL IN BRIEF:

The multi-specialty Hospital at Karakonam, as we see it today, has grown out of a very small dispensary established in 1894 as a community medical sub centre of the famous Neyyoor Hospital founded by Dr. Arthur Fells, a missionary doctor of Neyyoor sent by the London Missionary Society (LMS). The dispensary, though 45 kilometers away from Neyyoor, was visited once in a week by the doctors to render medical help to the poor, illiterate, ignorant and ignored villagers afflicted by epidemics like malaria, cholera and small pox. The first building built for the dispensary is still kept intact in the hospital compound.

In 1922, Dr. T.H. Somervell, who came as one of the members of the team that came to India for an Everest expedition and later on became a legend in the field of healing ministry and surgery, took over the Neyyoor Medical Mission. The Hospital and the Medical College are named after this great Surgeon.

After India became independent and the foreign missionaries left, the Neyyoor Medical Mission was managed by the erstwhile South Travancore Medical Mission of the South India United Church. (SIUC). In 1947, SIUC became part of the CSI. In 1959, following the linguistic reorganization of the states in India, the South Travancore Diocese was bifurcated into the South Kerala and the Kanyakumari dioceses. The hospital at Karakonam, which came under the Kanyakumari diocese was later taken over by the Medical Mission of the South Kerala

Diocese in the year 1975, the year the veteran Dr.T.H Somervell passed away in England. This led to the naming of the small mission hospital as Somervell Memorial C.S.I Mission Hospital, Karakonam.

The Church of South India came into being in September 1947 as an integrated Church to bring a union of Anglican, Methodist, Presbyterian and the South India United Church in the four southern states of Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh. The Church of South India Trust Association was constituted as a legal holding body of the movable and immovable properties of the Church of South India. The CSITA was registered in September 1947 under section 26 of the Indian Companies Act 1913 (new section 25 of the Indian Companies Act 1956) as a religious and charitable company which has no business character and with no profit motive. The properties of the Churches in Union have been transferred to CSITA. CSITA has been exempted from Income Tax under Section 10-(23c) (v) of the Income Tax Act 1961. It is recognized as a Charitable and Religious Organisation by the Government of India.

THE HOSPITAL TODAY

Passing through ups and downs, the hospital grew rapidly from 1986. It has developed from a 6 bedded dispensary into a 650 bedded multi-specialty hospital by a team of doctors who truly strived very hard.

The hospital has a network of community-based activities, carried on through its Rural Primary Health Centres. Free cataract detection and surgery, cancer screening and awareness camps, implementation of State and National Health Programmes, etc., are some of the community based activities the Hospital and the Medical College are engaged in. Insurance schemes viz RSBY launched by the Ministry of Labour, Government of India, Karunya Benevolent Fund (KBF) launched by the Government of Kerala, Hospital Insurance Scheme by Dr.S.M.C.S.I Medical College are being implemented successfully. This is how we carry on the missionary spirit that guided the founders to emancipate the poor and the needy from the bondage of poverty and disease.

THE BEGINNING OF THE MEDICAL COLLEGE

The Government of Kerala, for the first time in its history, took a policy decision in 2001 to permit the private sector to start self financing professional Colleges. One of the pre requisites for sanctioning a Medical College was the availability of a hospital with at least three hundred beds. The Somervell Memorial Mission hospital, Karakonam satisfied this requirement. On the application of the Medical Mission of the South Kerala diocese, the Government of Kerala granted *Essentiality Certificate* and University of Kerala, after due inspection, issued the Consent of Affiliation and permitted the diocese to apply to the Medical Council of India for the *Letter of Intent*. Medical Council of India after inspection issued the *Letter of Intent on June 20,2002*. The land and infrastructure required as per the norms of the Medical Council of India were made ready within a short period of six months with absolute trust in God Almighty who made the impossible – possible. *The Letter of Permission* was issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, New Delhi, on **13.11.2002**. and MBBS course with a student intake of 100 started in 2002-03. Permanent Recognition was granted by Government of India on 17th March, 2009. The MBBS seats are enhanced to 150 seats from the years 2016-17. MS/ MD courses in 11 subjects were started from 2012-13 with a student intake of 21 and all the courses are recognized by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health &FW, New Delhi.

A VISION FOR THE FUTURE:

The founders of the SMCSI Medical College cherish a great dream about the future of this institution. Our desire and effort is to impart value-oriented quality medical education that will produce sincere and committed men and women ready to serve the poor people of rural India especially the tribals of our mission fields and our country where ever they are called to serve and thus be a witness to the healing ministry of the Church. The South Kerala Medical Mission has School of Nursing running General Nursing and Midwifery Course, College of Nursing for B.Sc. Nursing, M.Sc Nursing Courses, and various Diploma, Post Graduate Paramedical Courses & Post Graduate Medical and Surgical Courses in the campus. With the amenities now available and to be provided in the years to come, it is the hope and prayer of the founders that this Medical College, with its allied courses and the multi-specialty hospital will grow into an Institute of Medical Sciences and will earn fame as a great Medical Institution all over India and abroad.

We expect dedicated, selfless, sacrificial services from each and every member of the teaching staff, non-teaching staff, nursing staff, administrative staff, medical and nursing students, their parents, the well wishers and all those who, in one way or the other, happen to be associated with this God-given institution. We take pride that this institution is our own and its growth and development are fully in our hands.

I. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The prospectus relates to admission to MD / MS courses for the academic year **2019-20 in Dr.S.M.C.S.I Medical College, Karakonam** and is prepared in accordance with the order No. FRC.50/17/MD/MS/DIRECTIVES dated 11.05.2017 from the Chairman, AFRC and GO)Rt)No.1366/2016/H&FWD dated 15.05.2017 subject to further orders from AFRC and Government during 2019-20. The Prospectus contains the rules and regulations applicable for selection and admission to the Post Graduate Medical Degree Courses **during common counseling by the Commissioner of Entrance Examinations, Thiruvananthapuram for the 21 seats including minority and NRI quota in Dr.S.M.C.S.I. Medical College, Karakonam for the academic year 2019-20.**

1.2 Duration of MS/MD courses

As per the **MCI Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000**, 10(1) & (3), the duration of the course including University Examination is 3 years in the case of Degree Courses.

1.3 CRITERIA OF ELIGIBILITY FOR APPLICATION & ADMISSION AND SELECTION SCHEDULE

A. Nationality:-

Candidates must be Citizens of India/children or dependents of Non-Resident Indians subject to satisfaction of the conditions prescribed in the Prospectus to be published by the DME, Trivandrum and notifications by CEE, Trivandrum.

B. Academic:-

- Must meet all the requirements stipulated by Government of India, State Govt, MCI and Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur **for admission to Post Graduate Degree courses, 2019-20**, as stipulated in the prospectus to be issued by the DME and notifications by the CEE, Trivandrum.
- Pass in MBBS/equivalent qualification from a Medical College affiliated to a University recognized by the Medical Council of India, New Delhi.

- c. In the case of an Indian national with the recognized degree from any Foreign University, the Medical Council of India may, on payment of the prescribed fee for the registration, grant temporary/permanent registration for the duration of the Post Graduate training restricted to the college/institution to which the applicant is admitted for the time being exclusively for Post Graduate studies. Temporary/Permanent registration to such candidates shall be subject to the condition that the degree is duly registered in the country where the degree is obtained and is recognized by the corresponding Council or concerned authority in India also.
- d. Candidates completed their Compulsory Rotating Resident Internship (C.R.R.I) on or **before 31-03-2019** are eligible.
- e. No condonation of internship (CRRI) will be accepted.
- f. (a) As per the **MCI Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations 2000**, students of Postgraduate courses shall be selected “9.2(a) on the basis of merit from the list of students who have qualified in NEET PG, 2019 conducted by the NBE, New Delhi.
- g. The minimum percentage of marks in the NEET (PG), 2019 for admission to **postgraduate medical courses shall be 50% (fifty percentile) for candidates belonging to general category and 40% (forty percentile) for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes/SEBC. The above categories shall submit Community Certificate and Income Certificate obtained from Revenue authority concerned. Those candidates whose annual family income is above Rs.6 Lakhs are not eligible for relaxation in marks. SEBC candidates shall produce non-Creamy Layer certificate from the Revenue authority for relaxation of marks in NEET PG 2019 examination, subject to issuance of detailed notification by the CEE, Trivandrum.**
- h. The students admitted will have to submit a **Bank Guarantee** at the time of admission, for the annual tuition fee during 2020-21 and 2021-22 and liquidated damages as mentioned in the prospectus published by the DME.
- i. **All the students admitted in the College shall serve the RHTC/ UHTC of the institution or in the mission hospitals of Christian Minority Community for a period of one year as Senior Resident/Tutor/Demonstrator at the salary rate fixed by the Government in Government Medical Colleges after successful completion of their Post Graduation course.**
 - i. The candidates selected for PG Degree courses
 - ii. Shall not discontinue the P.G course that has been allotted to him/her after the Spot allotment Process is completed.
 - iii. Dr.S.M.C.S.I Medical College, the candidates admitted to Medical Postgraduate Courses in Kerala shall serve the as Senior Resident as decided by the Principal of the College for a continuous period of not less than One year immediately after the completion of the course without break. The period of senior residency will be only from the date of publication of result subject to successful completion of course. Terms and conditions including remuneration will be decided by the Government of Kerala. In case the doctor gets selected for Pg Degree courses in Super Specialties he/she shall be relieved to join the same when he/she will be expected to complete 3 years of Super Specialty service. The Principal of the Colleges shall retain the certificates till such time as proof of the satisfactory completion of the courses given by the competent authorities ie, Principal of the college where bond posting is given as the case may be
 - iv. If a Post Graduate student including service candidates discontinues the PG Course after the “SECOND” Centralized allotment process he/she shall have to pay a sum of Rs.50,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty Lakhs only) as Liquidated damages to the Government of Kerala and also refund the stipend / Salary already received.

- v. A candidate leaving one course to join another, before or during the “SECOND” Centralized Allotment Process shall not be liable to pay the Liquidated Damages.
- vi. The Liquidated Damages will not be recovered from students coming from All India Quota to State quota and vice versa, provided the admission relates to the same year and before the last date of joining of FIRST round of Centralized Allotment.
- vii. If candidate including service candidates violate the terms mentioned in clause iii & x , it will be construed as Professional misconduct and the fact reported to the T.C Medical Council for suitable action including cancellation of Registration by the Council. A sum of Rs.50,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty Lakhs only) in addition to the stipend/ salary drawn during the period of the course and the amount spent by Government for their studies with interest as fixed by Government will be levied as liquidated damages from those who fail to do the Government service as stipulated.
- viii. The certificates which are to be submitted in the colleges at the time of admission will be released only after the completion of compulsory bonded service or in the case of bond violation, the liquidated damages are paid.

ix. Liquidated Damages and Execution of Bond:

In the case of Service Quota Candidates, he / she shall serve the Government for a period of 10 years or up to superannuation out of which 2 years should be in Difficult and Remote area as defined by the State Government to be served immediately after the completion of the course. The DMO of the district in which the candidates is posted will retain the Original Certificates of all the service candidates till completion of the bond If a Service Quota candidate discontinues the P.G course OR violate the conditions in the bond of service after the final Centralised Allotment Process he/she shall have to pay a sum of Rs.50,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty Lakhs only) as Liquidated Damages to the Government of Kerala and also refund the stipend/ Salary already received. A candidate leaving one course to join another, before or during the final Centralized Allotment Process shall not be liable to pay the Liquidated Damages.

The Liquidated Damages will not be recovered from students coming from All India Quota to State quota and vice versa, provided the admission relates to the same year and before the last date of joining FIRST round of Centralized Allotment. If Service quota candidates violate the terms mentioned in the Clause 12-2.9 above, it will be construed as Professional Misconduct and the fact reported to the T.C Medical Council for suitable action including cancellation of Registration by the Council. A sum of Rs.50,00,000/-(Rupees Fifty Lakhs only) for PG specialty candidates (in addition to the stipend/salary drawn during the period of the course and the amount spent by Government for their studies with interest as fixed by Government) will be levied as liquidated damages from those who fail to do the service obligation as stipulated.

- j. **Registration:** Candidates should have obtained permanent registration with the Medical Council of India or any of the State Medical Council at the time of admission.

C. DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS

Being a Minority Institution enjoying Minority Status Vide Order N. F.No. 469 of 2006 dated 21.06.2006 of National Commission for Minority Educational Institution, New Delhi, 65% of the total seats, ie, **14 seats out of the total 21 seats** shall be **Minority Community seats and seven seats shall be open seats** subject to reservation norms of Govt. as detailed below and

all the seats shall be allotted by the CEE, Trivandrum during the common counselling, during April – May 2019 .

1.4. MS/ MD, Course, 2019-20 batch

The number of seats available for admission in Dr.S.M.C.S.I Medical College, Karakonam in accordance with this prospectus and the course wise distribution of the seats shall be as follows subject to orders from Government and Admission Fee Regulatory Committee.

1.7. NRI Category

Students under NRI quota shall be who depends upon his/her father/mother/brothers/sisters (inclusive of first cousins)/husband/ wife/brothers and sisters (inclusive of first cousins) of father or mother/half brother/half sister /adopted father /adopted mother working abroad as per GO(MS)243/2014/H&FWD dated 06.08.2014 and further orders by Government from time to time subject to submission of the following documents to be notified by the CEE, Trivandrum.

1. Sponsorship certificate from the sponsor
2. Copy of VISA stamped passport of the Sponsor attested by the Indian Embassy / Consulate.
3. Copy of Employment Certificate of the Sponsor attested by the Indian Embassy / Consulate.
4. Relationship Certificate from the Village Officer concerned.

1.8. Tentative Schedule of Selection and Admission through common counselling will be published by the CEE, Trivandrum

Selected candidates shall report to the Principal of the College on the appointed date as per allotment memo from the CEE, with original documents and pay tuition fee and other fees including hostel fee **as per notifications from CEE**. The candidates who do not take admission on the prescribed date will lose their admission.

- a. The SC/ST/ OEC candidates admitted under the NRI quota will not be eligible for any fee concession or other benefits from Government/ Management.
- b. The PG students during their course of study from 2019-20, shall be paid stipend per month at the rate given below, subject to orders by AFRC on differential rate of stipend to non – clinical **subjects, as in the case of tuition fee per annum**.
 - i. Rs.42,000/- (First year)

ii. Rs.43,000/- (Second year)

iii. Rs.44,000/- (Third year)

VI. REFUND/ ADJUSTMENT OF FEES

6.0 If any student discontinues the studies without giving notice as stipulated at (12.2) above he/ she will be liable to pay liquidated damages equivalent to the tuition fee for the entire duration of the course. In such cases, all certificates including the transfer and other certificates mentioned in the preceding paragraphs will be issued only after payment of all dues, including tuition fees for the entire course.

- f. Attempt certificate issued by the Principal of the College where the candidate studied.
- g. Certificate from the Head of the Institution from where the candidate passed his MBBS degree indicating the MCI approval number and date.
- h. Completion of Internship certificate. If a candidate has completed his/her Internship from a non-teaching Institution, a certificate to prove the recognition of the Center.
- i. Registration certificate from the MCI or State Medical Council if available.
- j. Transfer certificate (TC) from the institution last studied.
- k. Conduct certificate from the Principal of the Medical College where the candidate last studied.
- l. Migration Certificate from the respective University (if applicable). Passport size photographs (8 copies).
- m. Physical Fitness Certificate obtained from a Medical Officer in Government Service..
- n. Community and Income certificate, in original issued by the Revenue authorities proving that the candidate belongs to reservation category as mentioned in prospectus.
- o. Originals of other certificates, the copies of which are enclosed with the application form.
- p. Any other document/ certificate required to be produced.
- q. Two sets of photocopies (one set self attested) of all the documents/ certificates listed above also have to be submitted at the time of admission.

VIII. ACCOMMODATION

- 8.1 Accommodation will be provided, by the College subject to the terms and conditions as applicable.
- 8.2 Food expenses will have to be borne by the students.

IX ATTENDANCE & LEAVE

- 9.1 A minimum of 80% attendance in each academic year is compulsory. Students availing long leave will be able to appear
- 9.2 for the examination only after additional six months / one year (refer www.KUHS.ac.in)
- 9.3 Those students who are required to do extended durations will have to pay additional fees.
- 9.4 Those students who miss University examination can appear only in the next university examination, which will normally be held within six months from the date of publication of result

X. DISCIPLINE

- 10.1 Decorum and dignity should be the motto of the students of Dr.Somervell Memorial Medical College. Keep up a refined culture in your words and deeds.
- 10.2 No one has the right to hurt another person mentally or physically. Hostels and college campus should be places of healthy and happy social life, mutual respect and exemplary behaviour.
- 10.3 The students are prohibited from all kinds of political activities, displaying posters, holding activities against the common interest, purpose or values of the institution.
- 10.4 Any action from the side of the students damaging or destroying the properties of the college or hospital will be viewed very seriously and a suitable action will be taken to make good the loss.

10.5 Students are expected to dress up neatly and decently. Jeans, Baggies T-Shirts and the likes are not permitted to be worn inside the hospital/ College.

XI RAGGING

Ragging is banned with campus of the Medical College as ordered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and circulars issued by the Registrar, KUHS, Thiruvananthapuram. It is illegal according to the Law of the land to commit, participate in, abet or propagate “ragging”. The institution will deal firmly and strictly with all instances of ragging. If any incident/s of ragging comes to the notice of the authorities, the concerned student/s will be given liberty to explain. If the explanation is not satisfactory, the authorities will expel the student from the institution.

XII Possession of Illicit Drugs, Alcohol and Smoking

Smoking is not permitted in public areas and on the campus of Dr. SMCSI Medical College. Students should not consume or serve alcohol on any occasion within the campuses of Dr. SMCSI Medical College. Forcing a fellow student to consume alcohol would be grounds for severe disciplinary action. The Indian penal code classifies obtaining, keeping or passing on banned drugs (such as marijuana, cocaine, heroin etc) as a criminal offence. Possession or use of banned drugs will result in expulsion from the college.

XIII. REDRESSAL OF GRIEVANCES

Any grievances/ complaints regarding selection and admission can be brought to the notice of the Principal/ Director of the college, within 24 hours of occurrence of the grievance. All complaints regarding selection of candidates for the PG courses shall be addressed to the Secretary, South Kerala Medical Mission who shall place the complaints before the Governing Council on emergency basis and communicate the decisions to the complainant at the earliest. Appeal if any shall be addressed to the Bishop & Chairman who shall convene emergency Governing Council Meeting. No changes in any policy matter will be entertained after the category wise results are published by the CEE, Trivandrum.
